Dear readers,

The European Commission Staff Working Document "Supporting the Teaching Professions for Better Learning Outcomes" (2012) acknowledges the challenge of better preparing teaching staff for inclusive education. In addition, the European Agency for Development in Special Needs Education - "Teacher Education for Inclusion Across Europe – Challenges and Opportunities" report states that less than 10% from the 29 countries offer a specialist in SEN during initial teacher education.

In regards to this, the innovative PRETTi Handbook:

- will include a model for early identification of learning difficulties among primary school pupils in mainstream education to allow for further adequate measures to be planned;
- will propose steps on the identification of "hidden" learning difficulties and special needs, which will be available for application with regard to all students in the mainstream education classroom.
